

**Berry Patch, Rose Arbor,  
Sunken Patio, Vineyard  
Among Sponsor Options**

Fishers architect April Hensley, a member of the Board of Directors of the Historic Ambassador House Project has coordinated the development of a Comprehensive Sponsorship Packet for potential donors to the project.

A digital version of the packet is now available.

The package includes a cover letter from AH Board President Walter F. Kelly, which cites recent progress and asks readers to help in efforts to propel the project toward completion.

The packet provides information on the mission and vision of the board as well as a history of the efforts to preserve and renovate the old “Mansion House” since it was moved from 96<sup>th</sup> and Allisonville Road in 1996.

Detailed information on sponsorship “adoptions” of various rooms and features of the house as well as certain aspects of the gardens and landscape also are offered. For instance, donors may sponsor the Berry Patch being planned for the heritage gardens for \$2,500. A shade tree can be “adopted” for \$1,000. At the high end an entire main floor room may be sponsored by \$20,000. The Donor Benefits section provides details on the amenities for various levels of giving ranging from \$100 to \$5,000 or more.
